Residential Fence and Hedge Guide









Non-Vision Obscuring Fences and Hedges include solid or partially open fences and hedges that don't exceed 3 feet in height and open fences not exceeding 6 feet in height. Open fences include chain link, widely spaced board rails or other materials that provide adequate driver visibility through the fence. See LMC 21.10.100(A)1.









Vision Obscuring Fences and Hedges include solid or partially open fences and hedges more than 3 feet in height, but not exceeding 6 feet in height. See LMC 21.10.100(A)2.





Adornments are allowed. When a fence 6 feet in height is permitted, an additional adornment may be added, not exceed a total height of 8 feet.


FAQs


Q: Do I need a permit to install a fence on a residentially zoned property?

A: Fences greater than 6 feet in height require a building permit.

Q: Can the City locate my property lines?A: No - A licensed surveyor can locate

Non-Vision Obscuring Fences and Hedges are allowed:

- In the front portion of the yard extending back 15 feet from the property line
- 2. The intersection sight triangle
 - To locate, measure 30 feet along each property line extending from the corner and draw a line to the end of each measurement to create a triangle.
- 3. The driveway sight triangle
 - To locate, measure 15 feet along the side of the driveway and 15 feet along the property line draw a line to the end of each measurement to create a triangle.

The remainder of the yard (4) may have non-vision or vision obscuring fencing and hedges.
